<p>Brief summary:</p> <p>Health and Wellbeing Boards were established across the UK as part of the reforms under the 2012 Health Act. This is the first Health and Wellbeing Strategy for Surrey, signed by the joint Chairs of the Surrey Health and Wellbeing Board, Michael Gosling (Surrey County Council Cabinet Member) and Joe McGilligan (Chair of East Surrey Clinical Commissioning Group). It sets out a model of system leadership that enables agencies to collaborate to avoid preventable deaths and illness and support recovery, and to do this through supporting individuals, families and carers through increasingly early intervention based on evidence of what works and produces good outcomes.</p>	
<p>Quality and patient safety issues:</p> <p>The document seeks to ensure that agencies in Surrey work together to improve health and access to services with a particular focus on the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improving children's health and wellbeing • Developing a preventative approach • Promoting emotional wellbeing and mental health • Improving older adults' health and wellbeing • Safeguarding the population
