Voluntary Sector Organisations offering EWMH Support

Barnardos

Barnardo's strong infrastructure supports THRIVE-focused, trauma-informed emotional health and wellbeing services underpinned by robust clinical governance, information governance and management systems. Barnardo's is an organisational member of the British Association of Counselling and Psychotherapy and can report into the MH NDMS.

In Surrey we deliver support to families and children through our Family Centres, disability support, children and young people involved in the criminal justice system as well as family support for the neurodevelopmental pathway. Barnardo's Surrey Positive Parenting Service (SPPS), runs parenting support groups to parents/carers of children/young people aged 6-18 years who are awaiting or who are in receipt of a diagnosis of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). Barnardo's has invested funding from its innovation fund to expand this to ADHD support for professionals in schools. We are keen to expand into ASD interventions both in community and in school with our evidence-based Cygnet programme.

Nationally we deliver an integrated CAMHS service in Birmingham, work in partnership with the NHS on Trailblazer pilots and deliver innovative support to children, young people and families facing mental health issues. In Buckinghamshire we work with our NHS partners to deliver a volunteer-led CAMHS buddying service, offering personalised early intervention for CYP up to the age of 17 as well as the SPA and CYP participation across the service, including transition planning. All our early intervention and prevention services build protective factors and reduce known risk factors, helping to support and help children and young people get the best out of specialist services.

Underpinning all our services is the desire to promote children's voices, rights and participation. We advocate on behalf of the children and young people of Surrey – to raise awareness of mental health issues, educate professionals, promote an integrated service and address stigma. We have experience running participation programs/Article 12 forums for CAMHS/EWMH services, ensuring the voice of the child and young person contributes to ongoing service development and improvement and linking with Adult Mental Health services for seamless transition and pathway planning. We are an experienced advocacy provider offering specialist advocacy to children and young people in secure units in addition to advocacy for children and young people in care and on the edge of care.

CritiQiu

CritiQiu provide a technical solution for non-technical people. We supply a quick, easy & engaging tool to assist with good mental wellbeing. As a cloud based service it means for our customers there are no requirements for additional hardware, software or integration.

Our service enables organisations to give early assistance to whomever uses our service, particularly useful for those individuals who have concerns but are not comfortable talking face to face or on the phone.

Our tools allow individuals to either vent anonymously, voice concerns, give suggestions or request assistance, without having to initially speak to someone. They can also be used to track, trend and provide further assistance throughout the process.

In addition, when the individual uses the tool this gives enough preliminary information to understand the high level root causes of their concerns, and thereby a representative with the appropriate skills can be assigned from the outset, as opposed to the individual being passed from pillar to post.

Our solution provides an initial single point of contact, ensuring early intervention as well as making sure the individual has consistency in their care & support.

Our tool is designed to complement practices and procedures, offering another avenue more in keeping with the mindset/actions of a younger demographic, whose first port of call is their mobile but rarely for phone calls. It gives, those who want a less intrusive/confrontational approach, an avenue to initially raise concerns.

Our tools have a huge array of features to help both the individual as well as organisations, by being able to spot issues early, see potential trends in demographics and much more.

Home-Start Runnymede and Woking

Home-Start works with families across Surrey. The majority of the families we work with have at least one child under the age of 5 but we also work with older children and their families. We currently hold the contract to deliver Early Help (SCC Level 2) support for families, however, we also work with families with higher levels of need.

We support families who are awaiting diagnosis or have been diagnosed with conditions such as ASD and ADHD. We provide emotional and practical support as well as parenting support and advice. We are also able to signpost families to other services in their area.

Spurgeons

Spurgeons offers a wide portfolio of services for children, young people and families. Founded in 1867, our mission is to offer every child a hope-filled life. We deliver specialist issue-based interventions to children and young people at risk of harm, focussing on their wellbeing and resilience. Our work also supports communities across England through our Children's and Family Centres, empowers young carers to reach their full potential and gives families impacted by imprisonment the opportunity to strengthen their relationship.

Surrey Care Trust

Surrey Care Trust runs a variety of projects across Surrey, tackling disadvantage, social exclusion and hardship amongst the county's most vulnerable families.

We run the Stanwell Family Centre, the STEPS Alternative Learning Centre, 'Nurture Through Nature' projects (including our Swingbridge Community Boats and Gateway Allotment), Adult Learning courses, free Counselling for under 25s and one-to-one Mentoring from trained volunteers.

We are delivering Surrey County Council's Level 2 'Early Help' support in 10 Surrey boroughs, and have a track record in effectively delivering volunteer-led family focussed projects that address social disadvantage and poor mental health.
